Diana Castro is a Ms. consumer of San Antonio **Independent Living Services** (SAILS) who learned the value of advocacy. Ms. Castro has two adult sons who have disabilities. She learned quickly that she needed to be their advocate to locate resources and services. She admits that

it is challenging at times because some agencies inform her that her sons must make the contact with various agencies since they are adults.

Ms. Castro says that she has been successful advocating on behalf of her sons for counseling services and obtaining their medications but it is hard to locate free or low-income assistance. ### SAILS Staff Attends 20th Annual National Conference on Rural Independent Living Living held on July 28-31, 2014

The Legacy continues: With Great Power, Comes Great Responsibility was the theme this year at the 20th Annual National Conference on Rural Independent Living held in Albuquerque, New Mexico on October 17-20, 2014. Three SAILS staff attended the conference to gain more professional education and training for independent living services.

The conference keynote speaker was Mr. Aaron Bishop who is the current Commissioner for the Administration on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (AIDD) at the Administration for Community Living at within the United States Department of Health and Human Services. Workshops included training for a quality and compliant RSA audit, a presentation on how to support consumer engagement in decision-making at CILs, higher education and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), youth peer-to-peer mentoring programs and outreach to rural communities and more.

There are many challenges for persons with disabilities who live in a rural community, such as transportation and affordable and accessible housing. The conference covered ways to remotely access people residing in extremely rural settings using Google maps (2014 APRIL Conference agenda).
