Consumer Juanita Hernandez has suffered with hearing loss for many years. Her old hearing aids finally gave out after struggling with them for a while. Ms. Hernandez wanted to be able to live independently by being able to talk with her family and hear on the phone. With previous hearing aids she needed to take them out to not get feedback while on the phone. Consumer said she "can hear much better now". She can have conversation with her family and they no longer need to repeat themselves or yell for her to hear them. Ms. Hernandez's daughter said she needs to get used to talking to her mother in a normal volume.

When Ms. Hernandez walked into the appointment to get her hearing aids, she was yelling to hear herself talk. After getting them fitted, she was just about talking at a whisper, the Audiologist said he needs to get hearing aids to hear her talk now.

She was able to get her phone and TV connected to a device that is connected to her hearing aids. So, she can easily hear the TV. If someone calls when she is watching TV, it will pause allowing her to answer and talk on the phone. After hanging up the show resumes. Both her and her daughter are very impressed with this technology advancement.

Ms. Juanita said they are working very well for her and that it is "a Blessing". She is very happy and thankful for the help she got with SAILS.
