He told me, "I want to be able to hear and communicate with the people in my community." SAILS IL Outreach Coordinator in Waco assisted him with obtaining new hearing aids through our program funded by the Texas Health and Human Services Commission.

Mr. Mario Dominguez: I Am Very Thankful For All The Help From SAILS

Mr. Dominguez is no stranger to SAILS.

He returned for help in 2020 because he was having trouble paying his bills. His truck had broken down and he was still paying medical bills from a surgery. "I was feeling preoccupied and concerned about paying my bills and wanted options for help before I became depressed over the situation." Mr. Dominguez's biggest concern was keeping a roof over his head. Then in a blink of an eye, like millions of people, Mr. Dominguez was affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. His supplemental source of income was cut off and he was making do with only his social security check. With the aid of his specialist IR/Volunteer Coordinator Shawanna Marshall, Mr. Dominguez received help completing a budget that met his needs. He also received guidance to enroll in programs that would help him pay his rent and electricity bill. He was even able to obtain food through the San Antonio Food Bank because of a partnership SAILS has after receiving funding form the CARES Act. "I felt relieved after I received help with my bills. A lot of pressure was off my mind. The help I received from SAILS and other sources was enough to allow me to get by long enough until the COVID restrictions were lifted, and I was able to get back to my normal routine."


Working with SAILS to understand my needs helped me to help myself."
