I first met with Mr. Alvaro Cruz on 09/08/2021. Mr. Cruz was my first consumer as I had just started with SAILS a month before. Mr. Cruz had lost his leg due to complications from diabetes and was in need of a prosthetic leg.

While there were some challenges in obtaining Mr. Cruz's prosthetic, SAILS was able to progress the case and provide it to him through funding from our Outsourcing contract through the Texas Health and Human Services Commission. I put in some hard work learning how to follow the rules of the contract and was very fortunate to have the support and training from my immediate supervisor, Abel Zamora throughout the whole process. He was instrumental to me learning the program but was also a big help to Mr. Cruz too.

When I asked Mr. Cruz what life was like before he received his prosthetic to now he stated: "I was depressed. I could not move very well around my house. I had to use a walker and would get very frustrated."

"I was surprised at how quickly you all at SAILS helped me and how patient you and Mr. Zamora were with me. I would tell anyone that if they needed help to contact SAILS."

Mr. Salazar has received items through the SAILS Outsourcing program, most recently, an Environmental Control Unit. Mr. Salazar depends on his newly obtained ECU unit to continue living in his home due to multiple significant disabilities. The ECU unit will allow Mr. Salazar to control many aspects of his home life due to his substantial limited movement. Mr. Salazar will be able to communicate better with his live in using the voice command features of the device.

Mr. Salazar is the embodiment of the SAILS program goals, to have consumers live in their home and maintain their independence in the least restrictive environment possible.
